#### Need for Renovation of OPRF Fields



#### OPRFHS is in need of a site for track and field

- Access to Concordia track ceases in the spring of 2024
- District is landlocked without meaningful options to add acreage to our campus
- Other options for partnering for a track are not promising
  - Triton: already sharing with other schools
  - Other High Schools: would push us to late workouts and no home meets
  - Any such arrangements would come with transportation costs (approx. \$40,000 yearly)



### Need for Renovation of OPRF Fields



Approximately \$6.1M in financial investments are already scheduled for OPRFHS fields.

- Track and turf on Lake Street field are in need of replacement within the next two years (approx. \$1.2M)
- Drainage improvements on our current back fields are scheduled for 2031 (approx. \$1M)
- Project 5 calls for installation of synthetic turf on back fields (approx. \$3.6M) and bleachers and storage on South fields (approx. \$349k)

The value of an outdoor track and multi-use turf field is multifaceted. It would

- be a valuable curricular space for multiple PE classes
- be used by multiple programs: track, x-country, soccer, lacrosse, Special Olympics, marching band, football, field hockey, ultimate frisbee, cheer, and drill
- enhance a community asset: a 400M track is provides more options than our current walking track
- serve our largest and most representative extra-curricular program
  - o approx. 250 boys and girls per year
  - o consistently representative of diversity within the OPRF student population



#### A Solution



#### Current concept...

By the Fall of 2023, have the following in place:

- 1. 400M track (with competitive field) on the back fields between tennis courts and stadium
- 2. Upgraded Ridgeland Common for softball programs
- 3. Multi-sport turf field on Lake Street (to be used in spring for varsity baseball)



#### Back Fields Track Test Fit





- Full 400M, 8 lane track including areas for pole vault; long, triple, and high jump; shotput and discus
- 600 seat bleachers on West side of track
- Full synthetic turf 65 yard x 110 yard multi-sport field within track
- Discus location would require installation of sleeves for temporary fencing between discus and track when discus is in use
- Installation of field lighting for extended use/safety in compliance with existing ordinance (lighting plan in development with poles at maximum of 45' in height)

### OPRF/PDOP Collaboration





Girls softball moves to Ridgeland Common with following provisions:

- 1. OPRF invests in scoreboards, new field turf, fencing, and/or other improvements
- 2. Girls program has primary access for all practices and competitions
- Enhanced facility-sharing IGA developed for other fields between PDOP and OPR F



#### Lake Street Field Renovation





- Varsity boys baseball moved to Lake Street field including synthetic turf field, dugouts, & bullpens
- Field lining for fall programming (shown) to allow for use of field year round
- New Special Use Permit needed to accommodate changes to lights, including
  - o repositioning on the field
  - shortening height
  - improving technology to reduce spillage
  - extending hours of availability
