

Citizen Police Oversight Committee

Information and Analysis for the Village of Oak Park Board of Trustees

July 2024 through December 2024

Overview

In accordance with section 2-30-1 of Village Code, the Citizen Police Oversight Committee shall, receive and refer complaints from citizens and thereafter monitor and evaluate the processing of citizen complaints. CPOC shall monitor and evaluate the Village's efforts in ensuring racial and cultural diversity within the Police Department. And on a semi-annual basis, CPOC shall meet with and provide written reports to the Village Board concerning the Committee's activities and any information and analysis of such information which the Committee may have compiled. The Citizen Police Oversight Committee also reviews Flock ALPR reporting provided by the Oak Park Police Department.

Complaint Process

Citizen complaints may be received by the Police Department, the Village Manager's Office, the Community Relations Department or the Citizen Police Oversight Committee. All complaints are presented to the Police Department for investigation, except under extraordinary circumstances in which (1) further basic information is needed to determine the most appropriate handling of a complaint, (2) and outside investigation of a complaint is warranted or (3) in those situations in which the citizen communication is more in nature of an inquiry than a complaint. Based on the seriousness of the allegation, the complaint is identified as formal or informal. Formal investigations are those which may result in a disciplinary order of a three-day suspension or greater. Informal investigations may result in disciplinary orders of suspension not to exceed two days.


Internal investigations include a review of the complaint to determine any rule violations. These investigations may be conducted by a Watch Commander or the Internal Affairs division. All recommendations or determinations are reviewed through the chain of command to the Police Chief. The Police Chief may concur with the recommendation, overturn the recommendation or request further investigation.


Once a final determination has been made, the Department notifies the citizen complainant of any action taken or any determination based on the complaint, and further notifies the complainant of his/her right to express dissatisfaction with the outcome to the Citizen Police Oversight Committee.

The Citizen Police Oversight Committee monitors and evaluates all citizen complaints and the subsequent investigations conducted by the Police Department. Complaints that arise as a result of dissatisfaction with the Police Department's final determination are specifically reviewed by CPOC. CPOC will then provide the Village Board with a written statement of the Citizen's dissatisfaction with the Department's handling of the citizens' complaint, the investigation report upon which the Department decision was based, and any recommendation the Committee may have.







Police Dept. Staffing = 104 (Sworn and Civilian)







PD (Sworn) Staffing = 81







Entry Level Staffing = 60







Supervisory Staffing = 15
















Complaint Analysis

Between July 2024 and December 2024, a total of 2 complaints were reviewed by the Citizen Police Oversight Committee. Of the 2 complaints that CPOC reviewed, 2 rule or policy violations were investigated against a total of 2 police officers or other police personnel. Of the 2 complaints, 1 resulted in a finding of an officer violating Oak Park Police Department rules and general orders. The internal investigation findings were upheld by the Citizen Police Oversight Committee unanimously for both complaints.




























RBO Zone Map:

Flock Safety ALPR Analysis This Period (July 2024 – December 2024)

The Oak Park Police Department (OPPD) utilizes Flock Safety ALPR cameras as both a preventative crime tool and to assist detectives with new and ongoing investigations into crime. Currently, the crime categories for which Flock ALPR may be utilized per General Order 4.68 and the Village Board of Trustees are:

Approved Crime Categories for This Period*

- 1. Violent Stolen Vehicles/Carjacking
- 2. Stolen Plates
- 3. Violent Felonies
- 4. Missing/Endangered Persons

Note: despite repeated requests by CPOC for evidence of "successful investigative outcomes" to illustrate the value of Flock Safety ALPR for this use, OPPD remains unwilling to provide such data. Consequently, there is no evidence whatsoever that Flock Safety ALPRs have played a meaningful role in any Oak Park crime investigation since their installation in 2022.

Conclusion

With a total of two stops and approximately 2.1 investigative searches per day over this reporting period, it is clear that no statistically significant crime prevention or resolution is realized by using the Flock Safety ALPR System here in Oak Park. Because OPPD is unwilling to share downstream crime outcome data with CPOC, it is impossible to gauge any actual benefit of Flock Safety ALPRs, especially when compared to real-life evidence of ALPR system misuse and mounting privacy concerns nationwide.

Recommendations

CPOC Recommends the Board adopt a Flock ALPR Oversight & Investigative Search Reporting Model (attached).
