Climate Coaching

Climate Coaches is a program run by Oak Park Climate Action Network (OPCAN) to provide technical assistance neighbor-to-neighbor advisory services on pathways to emissions reductions. This idea came out of the Climate Ready Oak Park Plan, specifically:

BD03. Implement an outreach and education program to raise awareness and connect residents, businesses, institutions, and property owners with technical and financial services for energy and climate resiliency upgrades, including federal, State, and utility programs.

- Timeline: Medium-Term
- Cost Range: Low
- Lead Implementor: Community Group

Climate Coaching

- Focuses on short-term engagements and referrals to professional resources (30 min phone call, emails, etc)
- Not a substitute for full -time paid labor or contractor
- Not affiliated with any of the vendors we recommend and we receive no money for referrals
- Respect the confidentiality of residents






Launched on March 11, 2024. Since then:

17 Climate Coach volunteers (launched with 13 and have since added 4 more)












What kind of home do you have?

51 responses



What did you do as a result of your Climate Coaching session?



"Energy efficiency testing and insulation. Next step is getting a heat pump installed."

"Started the process of researching green HVAC options for when our HVAC system needs to be replaced, and took steps to participate in the group buy for Solar panels."

"I'm scheduling a home energy audit to improve efficiency, I suspect that insulation improvements will be one of my first steps."

What did you do as a result of your Climate Coaching session?



"As much as we think we know this provided more options and education."

"There were a lot of questions we had about how to take the first steps with some of these initiatives, the Climate Coach helped us sort out all of the options available to us much quicker than we would've been able to ourselves."

Recommended next steps

- 1. Ramp up marketing efforts for the Climate Coach program through all Village communications, especially:
 - By bringing mention of Climate Coaches forward on the website (too buried now)
 - Repeating the OP/FYI notice in the fall/winter, and
 - Reminding audiences of the program through flyers, announcements, and tabling at relevant Village events
 - Feature article in Wednesday Journal
- 1. Fund OPCAN's recommendations for education and outreach in 2025 (included in our August email and discussed with the Village on September 12, 2024).
