SCOPE OF WORK AND FEE PROPOSAL

Project Scope

Phase 1: Understanding the Project

Duration: 6-9 weeks

- Scope:
 - Conduct a thorough site analysis and existing conditions assessment.
 - Inventory project area physical conditions
 - Identify ADA issues
 - Assess traffic concerns at Lombard, East and Bike lanes
 - Research relevant design precedents and best practices.
 - Identify successful street branding treatments
 - Inventory all identified segments of Chicago Ave.
 - Develop a compelling story/narrative for the project centered on Percy Julian
 - Detail his early life, education, and the challenges he faced as a Black scientist during the Jim Crow era.
 - Highlight his groundbreaking research in chemistry, particularly his work on soybeans and steroids.
 - Discuss his contributions to the Civil Rights Movement and his advocacy for underrepresented groups in his community
 - Showcase his philanthropic efforts and his dedication to supporting education and scientific research.
 - Facilitate four (4) mini-stake holder/focus group sessions
 - Plan and organize sessions in collaboration with Village staff.
 - Ensure each session includes at least two elected board members.
 - Sessions to include diverse group of stakeholders, including residents, business owners, school district and community organization representatives
 - Public Meeting #1
 - Organize, promote, and facilitate in-person community meeting

Phase 2: Explore

- **Duration:** 6-10 weeks
- Scope:
 - Generate three distinct design concepts that address the project's goals and objectives.
 - Design and develop conceptual design options that focus on enhancing the overall aesthetic appeal, pedestrian experience, and traffic calming/safety for two prominent intersections along Chicago Avenue:
 - Lombard Avenue
 - East Street
 - Review guidelines for Establishing Pedestrian Crosswalks and review IDOT suggested policies in relation to each intersection or midblock crosswalk
 - Collect ADT and speed data for establishing 85th percentile and average speeds at 1 location along Chicago Avenue to the east and west of Ridgeland Avenue
 - Evaluate corner radii based upon agreed design vehicles with the Village of Oak Park
 - Review crash history along the corridor
 - Evaluate the possibility of raised crosswalks or raised intersections, mini traffic circles or other appropriate traffic calming measures based on ADT and geometry.
 - Evaluate the need for striping and signing changes based on MUTCD recommendations.
 - Develop a comprehensive branding strategy, including a color palette and typography.
 - Design street furniture elements, such as wayfinding signage, gateways, and light pole identifiers.
 - Design concepts of how to integrate AR into the streetscape
 - Identify key locations for outdoor museum exhibits
 - Public Meeting #2
 - Present design concepts and gather feedback.

 - Facilitate final public meeting to present the refined design concept
 - Gather feedback and address any remaining concerns
 - Discuss the project timeline, budget, and construction/installation process.
