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OAK PARK AVENUE OBELISK ART INSTALLATION

I strive to create wondrous, welcoming works of art to enhance public spaces and appeal to all ages. I use the phenomena of light as an art medium, creating dynamic interactions that refract light into color. My art reflects my interest in geometry, science, technology, light and color to create luminous, interactive sculptures that welcome the public, animate the environment, and uplift the spirits of viewers -- to make the mundane magical.

I've been working as a professional artist for nearly 50 years with more than four decades experience in the public art realm. Glass, my primary medium, provides a durable, yet transparent, surface that can be laminated with other materials to achieve my vision. I work with high-tech holographic films and dichroic coatings that bend, or split, light wavelengths into a wide spectrum of brilliant colors.

My designs -- which range from free-standing "beacons," suspended "waves," to wall-mounted "lens" sculptures -- are site-specific, inspired by the surrounding space to create a unique sense of place. I use the optics of glass and structural patterns inherent in nature to design forms that interact with the natural phenomena of light -- refracting it into colors and projecting it into the surrounding space.

I'm very interested in BOTH Oak Park public art projects; however, if selected as a finalist for only one, it would have to be the Viaduct site, as the \$50,000 budget for the Obelisk is not adequate to cover studio production expenses, which is a shame as, in recent months, I have been fascinated by obelisks and have been researching their role in history.

I specialize in exterior sculptures; I have built exterior artwork in climates as diverse and extreme as Alaska, California, northern Italy, and Taiwan, where tropical storms are common, eight are located in Florida and built to withstand hurricane forces. I understand the special engineering, logistics and installation techniques involved in durable exterior construction and extra-strength structural attachments.

I'm an extremely organized, seasoned professional, and have a keen sense of organization and project management. I maintain a large well-staffed studio with a full-time crew. My studio equipment includes glass lamination, laser cutting, drilling and polishing equipment; a full metal work-shop; carpentry shop, state-of-the-art computer labs and space for assembly. My art is designed with the highest concern for safety, made from durable materials (glass and stainless steel) and are generally maintenance-free and vandalism-proof.

RAY KING STATEMENT

I conceive, design, fabricate and install all of my artwork; by fabricating my designs in-house I have greater control over quality and can increase the value I offer. I have a keen sense of organization and project management, and am conversant in a variety of durable materials. My works have been commissioned by universities, hospitals, municipalities, cities, states, federal government agencies, airports, transit authorities, real estate developers and private clients among others. In the past five years, I have been commissioned by Illumina Inc; a private retirement community; the cities of El Paso, TX; Denver, CO; Summit, NJ; Denton, TX; Tamarac, FL; and the state of Delaware Transit Corporation.

I'm an extremely organized, seasoned professional, and have a keen sense of organization and project management. I have extensive experience working with teams, enjoy the R & D process, especially in a collaborative effort, and excel at structural details. Most of my projects are done in collaboration with government agencies, community groups, cultural commissions, architects, engineers and construction workers. Many of my projects have involved substantial community consultation and public participation plans. Every community is unique -- public involvement can educate the community to my art and elicit the visions and hopes of the stakeholders. I welcome feedback to my designs and find the interactive process generally improves the final product and generates enthusiasm from the community. I consider this interaction as intrinsic to the public art process.

If selected as a finalist, I would analyze the various locations for their sun and light exposure to better understand and maximize the potential for interactive elements. I would research the history, culture and landscape of the surrounding community, the functions of the Community center facility and seek visual metaphors to incorporate into my design.

I am passionate about creating meaningful art that connects and resonates with the public. Experiencing art is an adventure that inspires and elevates the viewer. Seeing beauty in your environment is always welcome whether you are an art lover or novice. I think of my art as a gift to the people who view and experience it. I hope that it will stimulate wonderful new thoughts and feeling in those who encounter my artwork.

I design my artwork to fit the established budget, and in this case, the budgets of \$200,000 for the viaduct and \$50,000 for the obelisk would cover the scope of work.
