Loss prevention had the subject in custody, she concealed items into Target shopping bag while in the store and detained by loss prevention. Due to subject not passing the last point of purchase w/out payment, she was advised that she was banned from the store and could be arrested for trespassing if she returned.

The subject was in a verbal argument with his mother, who wanted him to leave. The subject related he has 5 yrs left on probation and showed R/O his probation travel documents.

R/O provided trespass warning to remove the unwanted subject who was warned to leave by security previously at 0527hrs. The security related to R/O that the subject was told to leave several times.

Narrative

In Summary: On 01 July 25 at 0023hrs R/O observed a subject a riding a bicycle with no front/rear headlamps W/B on Madison St approaching Highland Ave. R/O placed a stopped on the subject at Highland and Madison due to him violating L.O. 15-2-11 (Lighted lamps and audible signaling devices on bicycle). R/O ran the name through Leads which came back clear. R/O also advised that he is required to have a front/rear headlamp on a bicycle while being operated at nighttime. R/O gave a verbal warning.R/O`s BWC was activated throughout this incident.

In summary: R/O responded to the area of Jackson/Ridgeland reference man with a gun (m/w blond hair, black shirt black shorts with a possible rifle in book bag). Upon arrival R/O observed a subject, matching the description, on a bike s/b Cuyler from Jackson with a rifle butt stock sticking out of his book bag. R/O stopped the subject, at Highland/Harrison St.R/Os determined the rifle in the book bag was a BB gun. R/Os contacted the mother, who responded to the scene. The BB gun was turned over to the mother to be transported in her vehicle and she was advised of the reason for the stop.

In summary: R/o was monitoring radio dispatch via WSCDC relating that an offender (M/B, wearing a yellow vest, holding a khahki green bag and riding a bike) removed a rug from 4XX Madison and fled the area E/b on Madison.R/o observed the subject that matched the description (M/b, wearing a yellow vest, holding a khahki green bag and riding a bike) at approx 59XX W Madison St. shortly after. R/o subsequently stopped the subject, who was in possession of the stolen item (rug). The subject allowed R/O to search his green duffel bag for other possible stolen items. R/O did not locate any additional possible stolen items, however R/O also observed two power sanders (unknown owner information) inthe subjects possession that he related were not his. R/o was then told that the victim did not want to sign complaints but rather wanted her property returned and a report generated. R/Oalso observed the subject to be a suspect in an additional burglary case that required him to be identified. R/O forwarded the information to Ofc Kurasz #401 who took the initial report. The subject was released from the scene.BWC available.

The subject gave R/O a fake name that did not show up in LEADS. R/O detained the subject and upon further investigation, the subject was later identified. He was given a stop card and released from the scene. BWC activated.

MATCHED DESCRIPTION OF RETAIL THEFT OFFENDER (M/B 6`0, BROWN SHIRT, GRAY PANTS) WHO HAD LEFT THE STORE AT 4XX MADISON WITHOUT PAYING. POSS ID ON STREET. ITEMS RETURNED TO LOSS PREVENTION (PATTON). TRESPASS WARNING PROVIDED ON BWC

In summary: On 18Aug25 at 1432hrs R/O responded to the area of the Oak Park Green Line stop at 7XX South Blvd, called in by CTA Authority, regarding a suspicious person on the train matching the description of a battery suspect. R/O subsequently learned the person matched the description of the suspect, Aggravated Battery/Aggravated Sexual Assault. R/O monitored the description of a M/B wearing a grey shirt and black pants. R/O learned the subject had left the train station.

R/O observed a subject matching the above description walking w/b in front of 7XX South Blvd.

In summary: On 23AUG25 at approximately 0143hrs R/O responded to a tampering with auto call via WSCDC dispatch of 3 subjects one wearing a white hooded sweatshirt, and two others wearing dark hooded sweatshirts in the area of North Marion and Erie St who were seen attempting to break into a black sedan.

Once arrived, responding officers via radio related that two were detained, and one subject was last seen running through the Holley Court Garage. R/O relocated to the area of Lake St near Maple and observed a male, light skinned complexion, wearing a dark hooded sweatshirt running westbound on Lake St towards Harlem on the pavement. Following an uncooperative witness and no victim to be determined, he returned a clear LEADS status was allowed to leave and provided a stop card. BWC active.

Narrative

In Summary: On 02 September 25 at 0010hrs R/O observed a M/B subject riding a bicycle E/B on Roosevelt Rd passing Highland Ave with no front light on his bicycle. R/O placed a stopped on the subject. R/O's BWC was activated throughout this incident.

BWC was activated during the time of the call. FI card and IDOT pedestrian sheet were done by R/O.

R/O observed a subject matching the description in the area where Ofc. had last seen the offender and stopped him at 57xx Madison. A show up was completed by Ofc and the subject was not the offender. The subject did have work gloves and a construction vest in his backpack. BWC Incident.

On 05 September 25 at 0029hrs R/O observed a M/B subject riding his bicycle with no front light E/B on Madison St approaching N Austin Blvd. R/O placed a stop on the individual at Austin/ Madison St. The subject then fled from R/O on foot N/B on Austin Blvd from Madison St. R/O then was involved in a brief foot pursuit. R/O lost eyes on the subject around Mason Ave and Washington Blvd.

R/O went back to the scene to inventory the subjects bicycle into Beast, but the bicycle wasn't in the area. The subject has an active warrant for Robbery out of Cook County. R/O's BWC was activated throughout this incident.

On 08 Sep25 at 0820 hours R/O was dispatched to Marion/ North Blvd in reference to a battery.

R/O stop a subject matching the description given by WSCDC (Male White 50S 600 thin long hair black shirt and jeans).

In summary: R/o was dispatched 4XX Madison (Jewel Osco) for a retail theft, in which dispatch gave the description of the offender (F/B, wearing a white sweater, gray pants) that removed several items and fled the store (Tide pod bottles).

R/O responded to the area and observed a subject matching the description (F/B, wearing a white sweater, gray pants) in the 500 S Ridgeland/Cuyler alley. R/O subsequently stopped the subject in said alley just south of CVS (3XX Madison).

R/O asked why he appeared to avoid R/O when initially observed. He stated he went to speak with the resident of 2XX S. Elmwood because he works for him. When questioned about the OPRF sweater, he stated it was given to him by the resident's son, who allegedly attends OPRF. R/O then made contact with the resident of 2XX S. Elmwood. The resident confirmed he was familiar with Eiland because he had done yard work for him in the past. However, the resident stated he does not have a son who attends OPRF. BWC was activated during above interactions.

In Summary: On 13 September 25 at 1953hrs R/O was dispatched to a "Retail Theft" located at 3XX Madison St. Upon arrival, R/O observed a F/B subject now known as Britney D. Rodgers outside of CVS in the parking lot with multiple items without baggage. R/O spoke with a CVS employee who related that the above subject removed items from the store without paying for them. CVS related that they just want the above subject to be trespassed and for the items to be returned. R/O gave a verbal warning to the subject. Proceeds were returned safely back to CVS. R/O's BWC was activated throughout this incident.

R/O confiscated the marijuana and ET inventoried it. ET inventoried the ammunition.

R/O's were able to make contact with the other subjects parents to notify them of the stop.

R/O filled out IDOT pedestrian stop sheets.

BWC was activated during the time of the call.

In summary: R/Os observed a subject walking throughout post 12 in the roadway. R/Os observed the subject switch sides of the street multiple times to be on the side with parked cars and observed him looking in the window of a closed business at 1XX S Oak Park. The subject related that he is homeless and walks throughout the night. BWC active, not reviewed.

The description was a M/B, 30`s, wearing a black shirt, black pants and black cap on his head, travel North on foot from the Old Navy. R/O was inside the Metra station at 11XX North Blvd when a M/B subject matching that description walked in. R/O attempted a Terry Stop on the subject when the subject then fled on foot South through the doors at 11XX South Blvd. R/O was able to successfully detain the offender and later identified . A showup was conducted at 1018hrs. Positive ID on the proceeds and offender was conducted at 1020hrs. The subject was placed into custody at 1021hrs and transported to OPPD for processing where he was later cited and released with a court date of 01OCT25 at 0900hrs. BWC activated

Narrative

Chloe felt uncomfortable and turned W/B on the Jackson and walked to Jackson/Maple to approach her residence from the front. After Chloe crossed Jackson walking S/B, she observed the subject running toward her. Chloe then ran toward her residence and went to a neighbor's house before getting home safely. Caller related she called on today's date after the daughter told her that she saw the same subject near the mouth of the Wisconsin/Maple alley south of Jackson. She related she has often seen the subject in the area of 290/Harlem.

R/O observed an unknown driver in a grey Hyundai Illinois registration plates stopped in the middle of the street of Garfield and Austin Blvd. R/O approached the vehicle, activated emergency lights and attempted to curb the vehicle. Driver began driving Northbound on Austin Blvd and drove west bound on I290. Driver ignored emergency lights and continued westbound on I290. R/O lost sight of vehicle.

In summary: R/O initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle at Austin/Harrison. Upon passenger side approach of the vehicle R/O immediately detected the odor of cannabis emitting from the vehicle and observed multiple roaches in the center ashtray along with residue on the front passengers lap. R/O requested all occupants exit the vehicle to which all complied without incident. R/O requested consent to search the vehicle which the driver provided. R/O performed a search of the vehicle which revealed suspect cannabis inside the vehicle. R/O released the driver with a verbal warning and they were released from the scene.

Subject matched the description of the offender from a retail theft from 4XX N. Harlem Ave (Old Navy). Subject was detained inside Target (11XX Lake St). Subject was positively identified by Derry (loss prevention - Old Navy). Old Navy related that they will not sign complaints for Retail Theft. R/O spoke with a McDonalds Employee who related that they want the subject to be removed from the parking lot. R/O made contact with the subject. R/O had previous encounters with the subject and was aware that he had an active warrant out of Cook County for Larceny prior to making contact with him. R/O detained the subject and ran his name through Leads to verify. Leads check revealed to have an active warrant out of Cook County for Larceny . R/O placed the subject into custody at 2148hrs and transported him back to the station.

Appling was processed and offered multiple calls once inside the station.

R/O`s BWC was activated throughout this incident.

In summary: R/O received a call for service at 5XX S. Austin (BP Gas Station) reference a disturbance. Upon arrival the BP Gas Station clerk advised a subject took a bag of chips and left the store without paying. The clerk advised he wanted the subject trespassed and not to return. R/O advised the subject to exit the property and advised him he was trespassed and not welcome back to the property. He left the area.

In summary: R/O initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle at Austin/Erie. Upon passenger side approach R/O was met by driver, who provided R/O with his drivers license and insurance. R/O observed a single passenger in the rear passenger seat of the vehicle whom POTTER related was his cousin. R/O immediately observed suspect cannabis residue on the center console of the vehicle. R/O questioned the passenger how old he was to which he responded he was seventeen (17) and related he did not have an ID on him. He was advised to stay away from other peoples houses unless they know he is coming.
BWC active, not reviewed.

In Summary: On 21 October 25 at 2107hrs R/O observed a subject riding a bicycle with no front light S/B on S Austin Blvd approaching Fillmore St. R/O placed a stop on the subject and advised him of the above violation. R/O then requested the subject`s identification at which time he refused to give identification. R/O placed the subject into custody at 2133hrs. The subject was in possession of backpack as well. R/O searched the backpack after the subject was placed into custody which revealed the following: -A glass pipe which is commonly used to inhale drugs. -27 total .22 caliber rounds. -A grayish powder inside of a bag. BWC available.

BWC Activated. On 17NOV2025 at 2325 hrs, R/O was patrolling (foot) at Austin Gardens and observed 1 unknown female subject camping inside the park after hours. R/O notified the subject that the park was closed and advised her she would have to leave the park and relocate.

On 18 November 25 at 2151hrs R/O observed a subject riding a bicycle with no front light attached to it E/B on Madison approaching Taylor St. R/O placed a stop on the subject at 1XX Madison St. R/O advised the f/b subject stated that she has to have front light attached to her bicycle at nighttime according to Local Ordinance (15-2-11). R/O ran Rogers through Leads which revealed she was clear. R/O gave Rogers a verbal warning. R/O's BWC was activated throughout this incident.

On 19-NOV-25 at approx. 2316hrs R/O responded to Jewel Osco for a retail theft in progress. Before arrival, WESTCOM (dispatch) related to R/O's that a offender stole a bottle and now there is a possible fight. WESTCOM related that the offender who stole is a Male hispanic, thin build, black ski mask and black hooded sweatshirt.

At approx. 2318hrs R/O arrived on scene and observed a group of people standing outside Jewel. Upon arrival R/O observed the offender, matching the description WESTCOM related (M/H, thin build, blk hooded sweat shirt and blk ski mask) running away from the store. R/O activated emergency lights (red and blue) to attempt to stop the subject. He ran on foot north bound to the north Madison alley. R/O then exited his vehicle and attempted to detain th subject. R/O observed him run behind a parked vehicle in order to evade R/O. R/O then observed him run back south bound towards Jewel. R/O then preformed a take down on him due to SILVA actively resisting. R/O was then able to detain him with assistance from Ofc. with no further incident. Teh subject refused medical attention on scene.

The subject was found to be in possession of a bottle of Disaronno Amaretto 750ml valuing \$33.99. R/O took a picture of the bottle and sent it to ET NASH to upload.

At approx. 2321hrs Jewel Loss prevention officer positively identified the subject as the offender who removed the bottle of Disaronno leaving the store past the last point of purchase. At approx. 2322hrs the proceeds were positively identified as the bottle of Disaronno that was removed from the store. LP Jewel related he will sign complaints for retail theft. See offense report for further.

He was placed into custody at 2321hrs. Ofc. OWENS transported him to the OPPD in squad #538. While at the station he was allowed to drink water, use the restroom and make phone calls, While at the station he refused medical attention and at approx 0005hrs he then requested medical attention. At approx. 0013hrs OPFD #613 treated him for his abrasions (to both hands, left side of the face and right buttocks). The subject refused to go to the hospital. ET took photographs of his injuries. BWC was activated during the time of the call.

R/O responded to 3XX Madison St on 20-NOV-2025 at 1312HRS in reference to two subjects loitering by the front entrance. Staff member from the CVS asked both subjects to leave and both refused. R/O made contact with both subjects. The subjects identified themselves. R/O spoke with both subjects and both subjects agreed not to block the entrance of the business. Both subjects were informed that they are currently trespassed from CVS due to loitering.

On 21NOV25 at approximately 1242 hours, R/O responded to Target reference a Retail Theft. Patricia Doran was apprehended by Target security after she passed the last point of purchase with approximately \$100.00 of unpaid items. Doran was trespassed from Targe on the day of this report. BWC incident.

The subject matched the description of a retail theft offender and R/O made contact with subject at Madison/Humphrey. He was given trespass warning at the request of security. He was advised he could be arrested if he was to return to location. He given a stop card. R/O's body worn camera activated and not reviewed.
