Executive Overview

The Office of Adjudication conducts administrative hearings for the Village of Oak Park. Adjudication hearings are divided in to two primary categories: parking citations and code compliance violations. Also, Adjudication manages the juvenile adjudication process which seeks nonpunitive outcomes for youth that receive citations from the Village.



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FY24 Priorities

- The introduction of Youth Defense to adjudication hearings.
- Increase service opportunities and providers for youth by including organizations such as Build, Inc.
- Provide additional training to administrative law judges.
- Provide mediation services to resolve resident disagreements.



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
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New Funding Requests

Adjudication is requesting a status quo budget with the exception of:

- \$4,500 to provide additional training for adjudicators and staff.
- \$23,200 additional for external support: \$6,900 is for Youth Defense and \$16,300 in anticipation of mediations and additional hearings due to immobilizations and tows.
- \$8,000 for postage due to parking citation notices.







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FY23 Accomplishments

- Successfully transitioned Community Service Coordinator Position to Adjudication Intern Position in coordination with the Criminology, Law and Justice Department of the University of Illinois Chicago.
- Restarted the immobilization process.
- Filled vacant adjudicator and bailiff contractor positions.
- Launched Summer Martial Arts Day Camp for youth
- Continued recruiting providers for youth services at no cost or no additional cost to the Village.
