### **1. Go/No Go Evaluation**

Departments must:

- a. Complete a project information reference sheet
- b. Complete the Go/No-Go decision-making process
- c. Obtain department approval/consensus
- d. Submit documentation to Village Manager's Office (VMO) for review

### **2. VMO Review and Approval**

- Documentation reviewed by VMO
- VMO has authority to approve for the following scenarios
  - A. Grant requests up to current spending authority
  - B. Time-sensitive cases where board approval cannot be obtained in time to meet the application deadline if the following conditions (draft) hold true:
    1. Program/project is already budgeted for
    2. Project/project meets departmental priorities/goals
    3. No match requirements or the local match does not exceed Village Manager's spending authority
    4. No new compliance burdens
- All other requests would be submitted to the Board for approval with VMO recommendation.

Through data collection and analyses, focus groups, meetings, and interviews uncovered four major topics: access to care, gun violence, natural and built environment, and mental health and substance abuse. These are in alignment with the Board's goals for Community Health and Safety.

<b>Is this a new initiative or included in department budget?</b>	New initiative; 2024 Department budget includes funds that will be used for supplies, in-state travel, memberships, and conferences.
<b>Project Summary</b> Briefly describe the need for the project, who will be served, expected results and duration.	<p><b>Need:</b> After responding to the COVID epidemic, Public Health Department is rebuilding and expanding. The Department is building on the number and variety of public health programs we can implement within the community. As there isn't general funding at this time, the Department is seeking grant-funded staff.</p> <p>The IPLAN proposed the addition of three community health educators to the health education team. These positions will allow us to expand upon our current work. A Public Health Associate assigned to work with the Health Education team would assist us in the development of projects within our injury prevention portfolio, as well as implementing current programs. (The Health Education team is tasked with the development, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of public health programming; developing and disseminating health communication; networking and forming partnerships with nonprofits, governmental organizations,</p>

	<p>academia, and community members; and representing the Department at events and meetings.)</p> <p>Target Population/Benefits to Disadvantaged Groups: The population served will be the residents of Oak Park.</p> <p>Expected Outcomes/Results: To provide opportunities to expand and enhance the skills and development of the CDC Associate; to reduce the incidence of disease and injury, disability, and death; to strengthen the Department's capacity to prepare for, detect, report, respond to, contain, and recover from public health effects of public health emergencies. During the first phase of the Associate's engagement the Department will introduce them to all aspects of our programs, and to provide an introduction to the daily life and processes of working in a municipal setting. The Associate will be delegated various activities from existing programs. The next phase of the Associate's engagement will be to focus on projects from the IPLAN implementation plan: maternal/child health, injury prevention, and equitable access to health care.</p> <p>Project Duration: October 2024 through 2026</p>

The Associate will be supervised by Chelly Richards, Community Health Advisor, and Sara Semelka, Health Education Manager.</p>

We will need to coordinate with Human Resources regarding the appropriate onboarding process for a situation such as this.</p>

Community desire and support was and continues to be from our partners: River Forest Township, Oak Park Township, the Community Mental Health Board of Oak Park, the Park District of Oak Park, Rush Oak Park Hospital, and the Oak Park Board of Health.</p>
