The Plan Commission asked the Community Design Commission to review the draft Design Standards for single-family residences they have prepared for inclusion into the Zoning Ordinance. The Community Design Commission is currently required by the Zoning Ordinance to hear design-related appeals from building permit applicants regarding multiple family and commercial building exterior improvements. If approved, the Community Design Commission could hear exterior design-related appeals for single-family residence also.

The Community Design Commission reviewed the standards and graphics provided at their August 22, 2018 regular meeting and have the following comments;

- The graphics are very good and represent an appropriate visual representation.
- Ensure the proposed standards are contextual and any unintended consequences have been considered, such as the potential higher cost of construction.
- It is important that the design standards allowed experimental design and creativity as long as articulation and setback can be used to support the standards rather than relying on design standards that make all buildings and additions be "similar".
- Articulation may need to be defined.
- It might be appropriate to broaden the scope by using language such as "in general" which could be more welcoming to innovation.
- Consider "excellence" over design.
- Corner properties may need more specific standards since they have two exposures to the public street. An example was preventing an off-set second floor addition.

The Community Design Commission supports the proposed design standards.
