

Proposed

- The Village of Oak Park wants to **reduce waste associated with single use plastics** in restaurants, schools, and other eating establishments
- The Village will require restaurants to monitor their use of **single use plastics**: **containers**, **utensils**, **straws**, **and stirrers**
- Restaurants will need to send to the Village all of their invoices for single-use plastic each quarter
- Restaurants will receive a warning and eventually a fine if they don't reduce their single use plastic inventory by more than 50% over one year
- Straws will be given out to patrons only upon request

Why

- Single plastic has been shown to pollute the Great Lakes and micro-plastics are appearing in our water supply
- Other cities and restaurants have successfully adopted use of paper straws in 2018
- The Village of Oak Park wants to contribute to the reduction in plastics that are impacting our environment
- The Village wants to recognize the role that restaurants play in helping the environment

How

- Each quarter you will need to **collect and send any invoices for single-use plastics** containers (Styrofoam, etc.), utensils, stirrers and straws
- Train front-of-house staff to hand out straws and other single-use plastics (utensils) only upon request
- Switching to recyclable or compostable materials as quickly as possible eliminates the need for reporting

Support for your business

- Village will provide a list of acceptable alternatives to single-use plastic containers, utensils, stirrers and straws
- The Village and various agencies will have awareness campaigns about single-use plastics through public events and articles in OP/FYI and Wednesday Journal
- Agencies will give training materials on single-use plastics and alternatives for restaurant staff, if desired
- Recognition of progressive businesses that have significantly reduced their single-use plastics
