Thank you for the email. For clarification, staff did not receive Trustee Boutet's email. Thank you for sharing it as there is misinformation that is important to correct.

At the BAC call on Wednesday, October 28, Director Charley stated *Chicago* was announcing fines up to \$10,000 and Director Charley and I affirmed that Oak Park would not be taking that approach.

The Village's Public Health Department and the other Village staff supporting Public Health are focused on education. We are responding to complaints and working with the business community to ensure they understand. Enforcement is only required, which can include a 24 closure of a business, when education does not work. The Village is also aware that Illinois State Police are enforcing the State orders as well.

I will add your request for discussion of this.

Hi Mary Anne

Thank you for your inquiry. One or two trustees can not make a difference without the support of the full board, so I have included everyone in my response to your correspondence.

Last week, I reached out to Liz to check in with the business community and discuss what the Village can do. She invited me to participate in the "Business Advisory Council" (BAC) call the next day and I did so.

Mike Charley indicated that the spike in cases is mostly among young people between the ages of 12 and 30 who are largely symptom free. Restaurants and bars are specifically targeted for closure because young people are going out, getting COVID and spreading it. The closures are directed at them. Paces like George's, Delia's Kitchen, Cozy Corner and the like are taking measures to be safe and are not catering to the "young and the restless." So, in my opinion, a more nuanced approach is warranted.

On the BAC call, our staff indicated that they would be enforcing the Governor's closure order first with a warning, then with a citation with potential fines of up to \$10,000. I have, and I indicated, a general disagreement with imposing heavy fines on struggling businesses, but I am only one trustee. Formal direction to staff needs to come from the full board.

[As a process matter, I learned that the businesses who formed the BAC welcome the participation of elected officials. However, we don't get affirmatively invited, so I was the only one on the call.]

I am trusting that Deno and the other electeds would disagree with imposing heavy fines on businesses that are trying to survive. We need to direct our staff to take a softer approach to enforcement. Some communities are using a voluntary compliance approach or not enforcing closure orders at all. This needs to be discussed by the board.

By copying the board, I am opening it up to a second to discuss this. I am also eager to hear from the businesses as to any other ideas to help them survive this crisis. I expect that to happen on the call Deno indicated he would schedule this week.


