Agenda Item Title

A Resolution Authorizing the Use of Motor Fuel Tax Funds for Maintenance of Streets in the Village of Oak Park for the 2017 Fiscal Year

Overview

The Village receives a monthly distribution of Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) funds from the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT). The Illinois Highway Code requires that each municipality receiving MFT funds use those funds for the limited purposes described in the Highway Code. Those approved uses generally relate to the costs of labor and materials for construction and maintenance of the public right of way. The Village is required to adopt a Resolution which obligates its share of Motor Fuel Tax Funds to one or more of the approved purposes set forth in the Highway Code.

Staff Recommendation

Approve the Resolution.

Fiscal Impact

The Budget provides for an expenditure of \$1,344,000.00 in MFT funds in Fiscal Year 2017. The Resolution provides for an estimated \$1,344,000.00 to cover the estimated MFT funds received.

Background

The "Municipal Estimate of Maintenance Costs" attachment itemizes approved uses of \$1,344,000.00 in Motor Fuel Tax funds. The attachment proposes using the funds for salaries and overtime related to public works operations in the public right of way, the purchase of salt and electricity for street lighting as described more fully on the Attachment.

IDOT is charged with supervising and approving the Village's expenditure of MFT funds. IDOT will review the Resolution and indicate its approval and returning it to the Village.

The Village Board has approved similar Resolutions in prior years.
