#### **Agenda Item Title**

An Ordinance Authorizing the Disposal of Surplus Property Owned by the Village of Oak Park

#### Overview

The Development Customer Services Department Parking & Mobility Services Division has various items that can be disposed as surplus because they are no longer useful to the Village. Pursuant to an Independent Contractor Agreement, a Contractor will remove various meter poles, backfill the concrete or soil where necessary, and haul away and scrap the poles and meter casings.

#### Recommendation

Approve the Ordinance.

#### **Fiscal Impact**

The Contractor anticipates a credit will be applied to the project based on the financial return from scrapping the surplus materials. A receipt from the scrap yard will be provided to the Village along with the final invoice for the project. Pursuant to an Independent Contractor Agreement, the total not-to-exceed amount for the project is \$3,621.45.

#### **Background**

In accordance with Village policy and State law (65 ILCS 5/11-76-4), the Village may, by Ordinance, authorize the disposition of designated personal surplus property in order to dispose of items no longer usable to the Village. Because the identified surplus items have limited revenue opportunities for selling and the cost of removing and transferring the items would supersede their scraping value, Village staff has identified a business, Garcia Property Maintenance, that will absorb a portion of the cost of removing said surplus items in trade for the value achieved by said company in scraping the items. The items brought forth in the recommended ordinance have little to no resale value due to their condition or they have reached their useful life. The items identified for surplus include the following: 317 meter casings that were replaced with Cale paystations in 2022. The contractor will also cut down 201 meter poles throughout the Village that are no longer in use, backfilling the holes that are left behind, where applicable.
